Course Title: Homiletics – 7 Credits Prerequisite: Hermeneutics Approximate Length: 14 Sessions Intended Audience: General Clerical Body

Course Objective:

Homiletics is the study of sermon preparation and delivery.

In this course we will review and discuss the theory and practice of preaching, focusing on methods, outlines, guides for study, the use of illustrations, and the selection of texts.

Principles of Ministry Syllabus

Course: Principles of Ministry – 7 Credits **Instructor: Elder David Jones**

Course Objectives

The objective of this course is to provide insight into various Christian principles which are vital to having and working within a successful Christian ministry in today's church.

Students completing this course will gain the following competencies:

- The ability to provide a working denotative definition and understanding of Christian ministry and spiritual disciplines
- The confidence to share in-depth an understanding of course specified spiritual disciplines and other valuable ministry concepts used to make the minister more effective in their ministry
- The ability to begin and maintain a spiritual journal that will chronicle student's spiritual progress relating to covered spiritual disciplines and concepts
- The skill of sharing insight about how spiritual disciplines and related concepts can increase the intensity and effectiveness of personal spiritual health and vitality
- Gain insight of how spiritual disciplines and related concepts can increase the intensity and effectiveness of personal spiritual health and vitality
- The ability to share, by practical experience, how covered spiritual disciplines and related concepts promote a greater sense of awareness of the presence of Christ in the life of each believer

Class Format

This course will contain a great deal of discussion and possible debates. Group work and role-play, for the purpose of promoting unity among class participants, will also be an intricate part of the class format. A midterm and final will be required for this course. A detailed and chronological spiritual journal will also be required of each student (more information regarding journal will be provided on first day of class). Students successful in this course will be expected to complete all given class assignments, homework, group work, exams, and spiritual journal. Although group work will be required; each member will receive a grade based on individual effort. Class participation will count as 5% of overall grade. Students will only be allowed to have two unexcused absences during course period. Each unexcused absence will result in the loss of a letter grade. Four unexcused absences will result in student being dropped from the class.

- Any aspiring clerical candidates must have a letter of recommendation from a Pastor of a Cape Fear and Southwestern OFWBAC church

Non-Conference Clergy

Tuition shall be One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per course not including any required books.
