Some former trustees were: Bro. Foster Armstrong and Deacon Walter Massey, Rev. James Tew, George Armstrong, and Harold Munn.

Deacon Stanford Murphy and Deacon James Lawrence served faithfully as deacons until their death.

Yes, we thank God for where he has brought us from; Mule and wagons, out houses, lamp lights, hished windows, board pews, no carpet, and dusty road.

During the 89 years that our church has been in existence we have made many improvements from building a new church, paving the road to the church and purchasing equipment to keep the church running smoothly.

Our Preachers Elder John Woods
